Establishment of oil palm plantation is subjected to Environmental Quality (Prescribed Activities) (Environmental Impact Assessment) Order 2015¹ EIA was enforced in April 1988. Approval of the EIA is required prior to the commencement of land opening or clearing and the EIA approval will normally come with a set of Conditions of Approval (Jadual Pematuhan) by Dept. of Environment.
